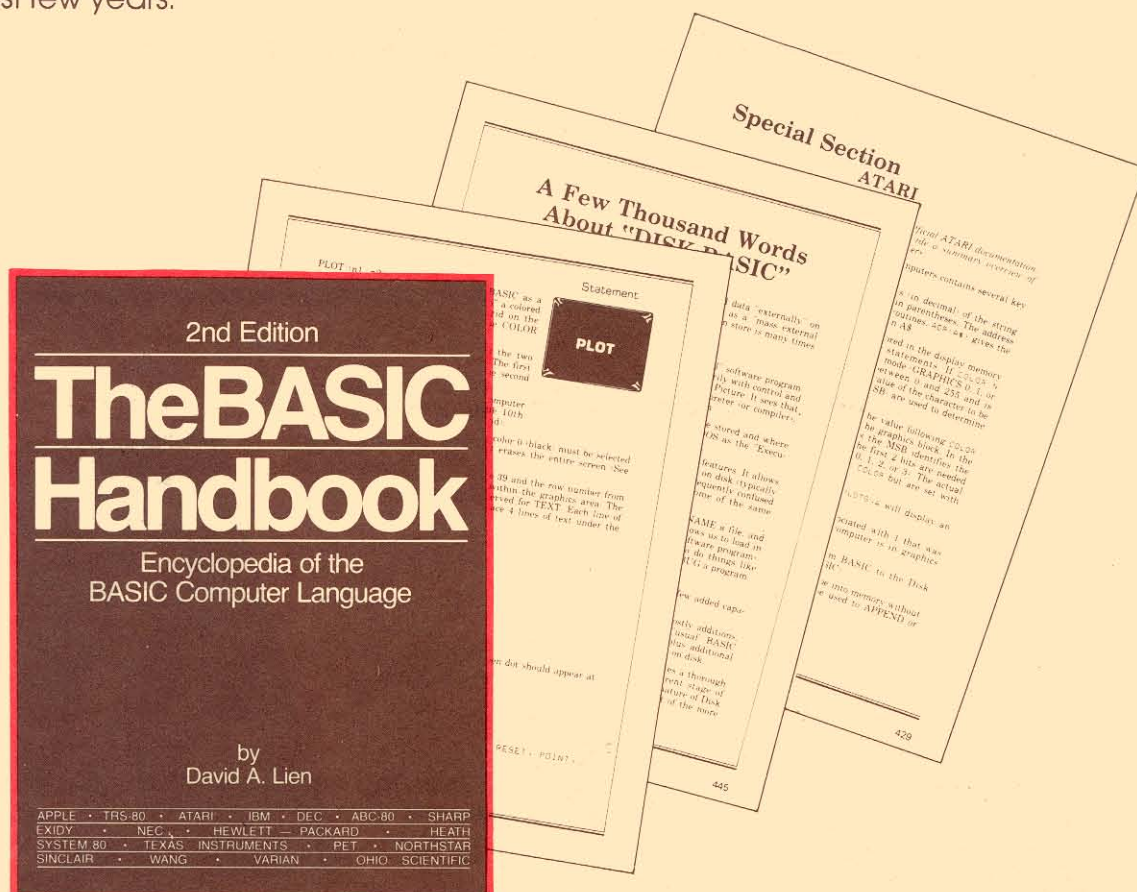
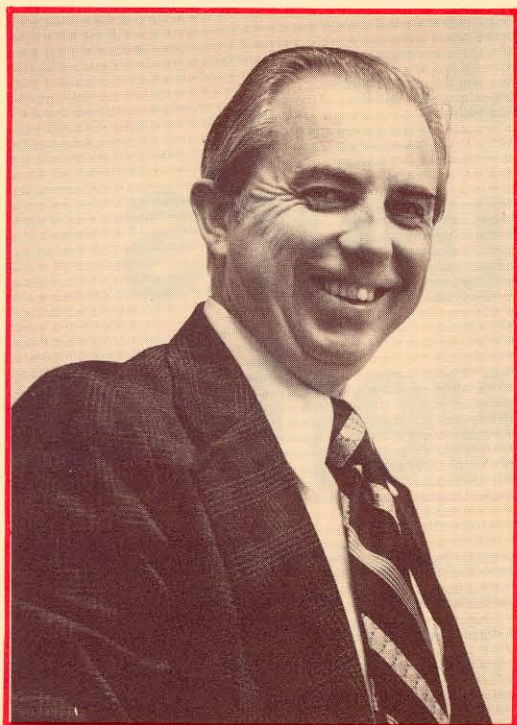

Special sections deal with converting Level I programs to Level II and using the expansion interface with its real-time clock, dual cassette capability, and printer port. PLUS, there are several appendices, including a special "LEVEL II Error Message Reference Guide" with sample programs to explain error messages.
