MODEL 100 TECHBOOK:

"Inside the Model 100" This Technical Book tells everything about the Portable Model 100 Computer. It has a ROM Map, listings of the 8080/8085 and Z-80 OpCodes and Memory Index. This is ideal for understanding the LCD - RS232-Modem - Printer Interface - Bar Code Reader - Clock and Cassette Hardwares. It cost \$20.00. Ph: 216/729-2858. 80386 MACHINES:

What is a "386"? It is a micro-chip that allows large "AT" style machines to run faster and hold more information. The Computer World expects I.B.M. to feature this type of equipment. Tandy uses the 80386 for its newest machines. This micro-chip is the latest fad. You will read about it for a long time to come. Still, if you don't require this type of equipment, don't waste your time, or money, for one.

SOLITAIRE (P/N 6276565):

Now you can play your favorite card game without ever having to buy the cards. This MS-DOS game is for Tandy's 1000-2000 etc. computers. It costs \$20.00 (and you can't cheat anymore). Ph: 1-800/IBM-PCSW. This version of solitaire is the "Klondike" game.

RADIO SHACK EDUCATIONAL CATALOG:

The 1987 Educational Software Catalog is available. It covers all of the Tandy Machines and includes Business Training to Pre-School Teaching Skills. The Book will be at the Club Meetings.

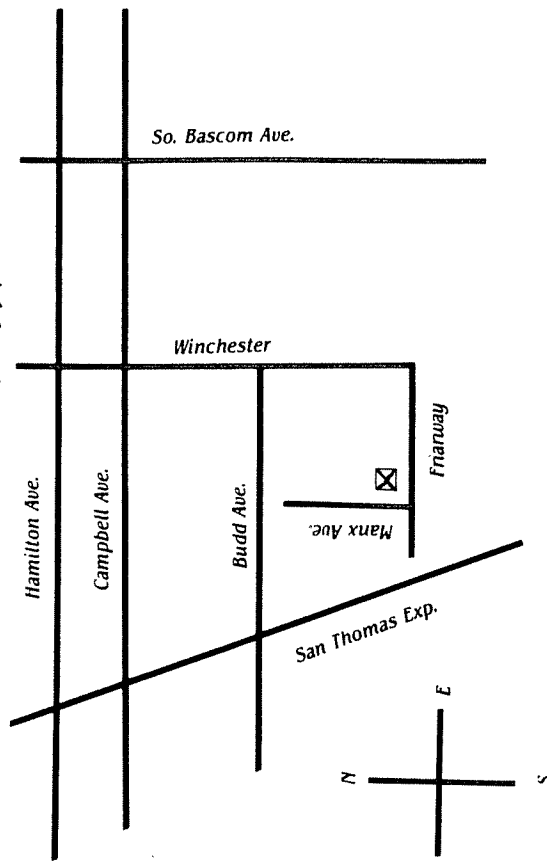

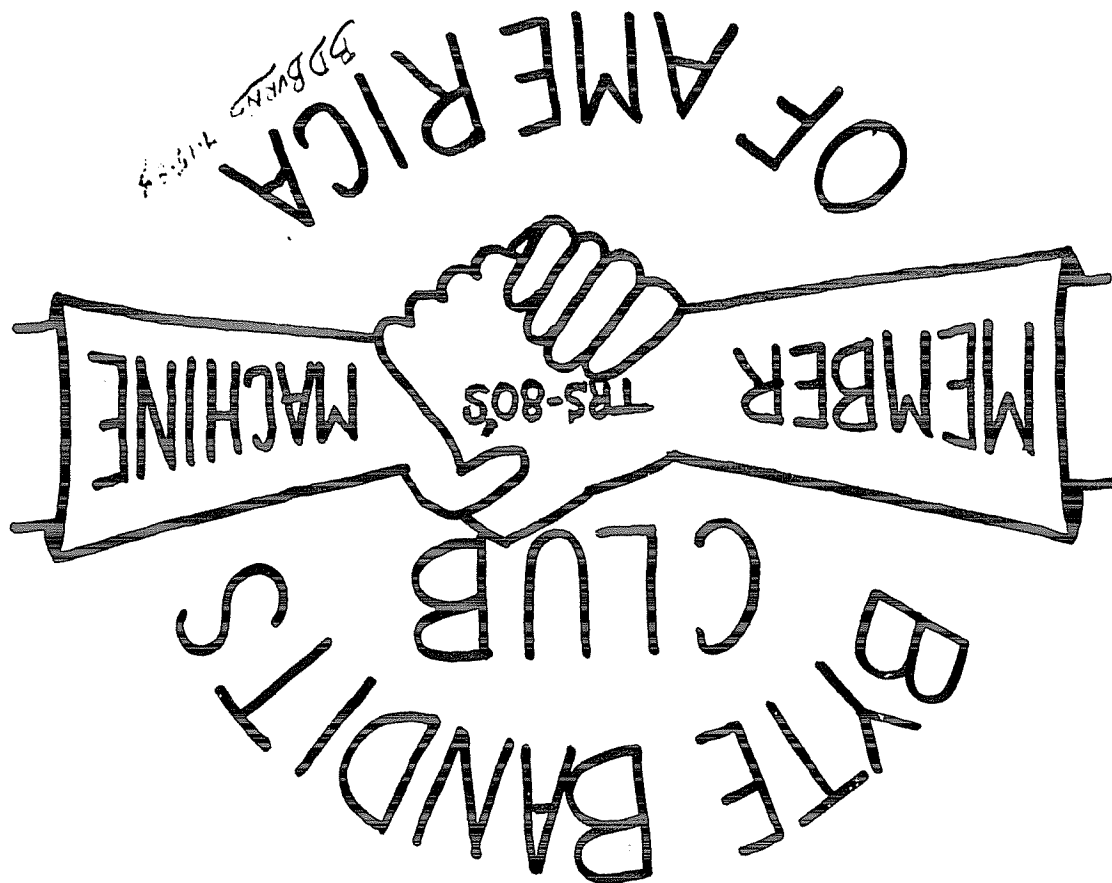
